HKFW Introduction

The Hong Kong Federation of Women (HKFW), founded by charter chairperson Peggy Lam, who invited 10 other prominent ladies to be members of the Founding Committee, was established on 28 June, 1993. The Federation is a non-profit making and non-political organization. The main objectives of which are to unite women from all walks of life, to encourage them taking an active interest in Hong Kong affairs, to improve and protect the lawful rights of women and to liaise with women organizations all over the world.

Members of the Federation come from various levels, occupations, races, and districts in Hong Kong. Amongst members are business women, professionals, workers and housewives as well as those who are fervent in women development and advancement. The membership of the Federation is over 1,600, with more than 60 corporate members from all over Hong Kong, Kowloon and the New Territories. Total membership of these organizations exceeds 100,000.

HKFW has also taken the lead to encourage and subsidize local women organizations to develop their community affairs in order to build a harmonious society. Under the dedication and enthusiastic participation of the Council and its members, HKFW has organized over 100 prominent projects, activities and meaningful services annually to further its objectives and mission. Position Papers on community issues and government policies have been submitted to the HKSAR Government to advocate women's opinions and views on public issues. The Vocational Training Courses organized at the four HKFW Retraining Centres, which help equip women with skills and knowledge to cope with their needs, have achieved promising results.

To cater for the educational needs of women and children in the mainland, 24 vocational training schools and 4 clinics had been built in the mountainous areas. Mother water wells in Inner Mongolia and 5 vehicles were donated for the benefit of women and youth in northwestern China.

The achievement of the Federation has gained constant support and recognition from the general public. The Federation will continue to tap on the valuable resources, talents and potentials of its members, to solicit their contributions and participation to strive for excellence and for the betterment and harmony of the Hong Kong society.

Ms. Kristín Aðalbjörg Árnadóttir
Ambassador of Iceland in China

Ms. Kristin A. Árnadóttir is currently the Ambassador of Iceland to China, Australia, Cambodia, Laos, Mongolia, New Zealand, North Korea, South Korea, Thailand and Vietnam. Ms. Árnadóttir was an Ambassador in various offices of the Deputy Permanent Secretary of State of Iceland from 2008 to 2009 before she took up her present position in January 2010. She was a Special Envoy of the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Iceland in 2007-2008.

Before joining the diplomatic service, Ms. Árnadóttir had worked for the Women's Alliance, and was a journalist until she became a Consultant in the Department of Media and Arts in the Ministry of Culture and Education in 1988. She was the International Coordinator in the Office of International Education of the University of Iceland from 1991-1994. In 1994, she became the Political adviser to the Mayor of Reykjavik and held the positions of Director of Development and Information and the Director of the Secretariat of the Mayor of the City of Reykjavik during the period from 2001 to 2007.

Ms. Árnadóttir studied in the University of Iceland and Syracuse University of USA, and she has a Master of Arts Degree in Public Administration and Governance.

Ms. Julie T. Broussard
Country Programme Manager,
UN Women China Office

Ms. Julie T. Broussard has lived and worked in China for more than 10 years and speaks fluent Chinese. Since March 2009, she has worked as the Country Programme Manager for the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN Women) office in China. Along with a staff of eight, Julie is responsible for managing a variety of UN Women projects and programmes that promote gender equality and women's empowerment in China.

Prior to taking up this position with UN Women, she obtained a doctorate degree from the Harvard Graduate School of Education. For her degree, she conducted research on an environmental education and women's empowerment project in Gansu Province, China. Her primary areas of expertise are gender, environment, poverty alleviation, and education.

Before obtaining this degree, Ms. Broussard worked for several UN agencies in China. She served as a programme officer for UNFPA from 1999-2001 and as a programme assistant for UNESCO from 1996-1997. She also served as a UN volunteer in Yunnan Province from 1997-1998, helping to coordinate a poverty alleviation programme in a remote, rural county. In addition, she worked for an international NGO for six months in 1999. In the early 1990s (1990-1993), she worked as an English teacher at two Chinese universities. She also has Masters Degrees from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and Indiana University, as well as a Bachelor's Degree from Northwestern University.

Ms. Broussard lives in Beijing with her husband and two young daughters.

Mrs. Carter Malik
Founder and Director of the Yunnan Mountain Heritage Foundation

Mrs. Carter Malik is the founder and Director of Yunnan Mountain Heritage Foundation in China. The Yunnan Mountain Heritage Foundation (YMHF) is a non-profit making organization founded to protect and promote cultural heritage, handicrafts, and ecotourism in Shangri-La, Yunnan. YMHF projects include poverty alleviation, sustainable livelihood and job creation in local rural communities. Mrs. Malik was awarded the title "Honorary Citizen of Shangri-La" in September 2007 at the celebration of the 50th anniversary of the Diqing Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture.

Mrs. Malik's work includes several conferences on the preservation of cultural assets of Shangri-la: Friends of Shangri-La 1 (2005) and Friends of Shangri-La 2 (2007), and the first National Parks Workshop (2006). Mrs. Malik opened the Shangri-la Handicraft Center in 2006. Based in an old Tibetan town house, the Center houses a handicraft shop, a community library, volunteer residence, and meeting rooms. The Handicraft Shop is a showcase for local indigenous crafts.

Thank You Small Library opened in 2008 and is a busy learning center. Volunteer teachers give lessons daily in Mandarin and English to students of all ages. Old Town people are welcome to become members and check out library books. The center has co-sponsored a Bee Keeping project with Shangri-la Farms for rural farmers. This ground breaking project has provided training to more than 150 farmers and has become a showcase project for sustainable beekeeping in the area.

Mrs. Malik lives in New York with her husband, Khalid Malik, Director of the United Nations Human Development Report Office. She travels to Shangri-la several times a year to oversee the project at the YMHF Handicraft Center in the old town. Her background is sustainable tourism and handicraft development: design and marketing.

Mrs. Malik has written several published articles on crafts including her contribution to Berg Encyclopedia of World Textiles on Uzbekistan's famed textiles; History of Asian Embroidery: Uzbekistan's Souses. She has worked in Nepal, Uzbekistan, United States and China on handicraft development projects.

Ms. Annikki Arponen
Consul General of Finland in Hong Kong

Ms. Annikki Arponen is currently the Consul General of Finland in Hong Kong and Macau.

Ms. Arponen has extensive experience in international diplomacy. Before she joined the Ministry for Foreign Affairs in 1983, she was Project Manager at the Finnish Fair Corporation from 1976 to 1978 and interpreter and educator for Asian refugees in Finnish Red Cross from 1978 to 1982. Her first job in the diplomatic service was Attaché, Second Secretary, at the Embassy of Finland in Beijing from 1983 to 1991. After a year serving as a Press Officer in the Ministry, Ms. Arponen became the Second Secretary in the Political Section of the Embassy of Finland in Beijing in 1992 until 1996 when she was transferred to become the Desk Officer in the Unit for Asia, Africa and Latin America. In 1998, she returned to the Embassy of Finland in Beijing and became the First Secretary. From 2001 to 2010, she was Counsellor, East Asia regional team manager and China team leader in the Department for Asia and the Americas. Ms. Arponen took up her present post in 2010.

Ms. Arponen graduated from University of Helsinki in 1973 and had further her studies in Beijing Language Institute, Peking University and Chinese University of Hong Kong. She holds a Master of Arts Degree and is a sinologist and an authorized Chinese-Finnish translator. With her extraordinary knowledge in sinology and translation, she translated the "Dao De Jing", the Taoism classic, into Finnish and published "Chinese-Finnish Dictionary" in 1985 and 1986, respectively.

Professor Cheng Kai-ming
Chair of Education,
University of Hong Kong

Professor Kai-ming Cheng is Chair Professor of Education at the University of Hong Kong. He was Dean of Education, Pro-Vice-Chancellor and, until recently, Senior Advisor to the Vice-Chancellor of the University.

Trained as a mathematician, he was a school teacher and a principal before he pursued doctoral study at the London Institute of Education. He taught at the Harvard Graduate School of Education as Visiting Professor from 1996-2006. His current attention has been on the fundamental changes in society and their challenges to education, and therefore the attention to learning as the core business of education. He has undertaken various projects related to reforms, policy-making, legislation and institutional evaluation in many countries across continents.

He has been consultant with the World Bank, Asian Development Bank, UNESCO and UNICEF. He plays advisor to institutions in Japan, China and Russia on fundraising and internationalization. Most recently, he has been appointed to the National Advisory Committee on Curriculum Reform in China, and also members of the Advisory Committees on Education Policies in Shanghai and Guangdong. He is co-convenor of the interdisciplinary Strategic Research Theme on Sciences of Learning at HKU. Locally he is a member of the Education Commission and was instrumental in the on-going comprehensive reform which started 1999. He chaired the Advisory Committee on Teachers Education and Qualifications. He is currently Chairman of the Standing Committee on Language Education and Research. He writes a weekly column in the Hong Kong Economic Journal Daily and a monthly column in Shanghai Education and Escuela (Spain).

Mr. Frank Ching
Author

Mr. Frank Ching is a journalist and writer who has reported and commented on events in Asia, particularly China, Hong Kong and Taiwan, for many years. Mr. Ching worked for The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal and the Far Eastern Economic Review. He opened The Wall Street Journal's bureau in China after the normalization of U.S.-China relations, thus becoming one of the first four American newspaper reporters to be based in Beijing since 1949.

Mr. Ching's articles have appeared in Foreign Affairs, Foreign Policy, World Policy Journal, China Quarterly, Current History, the Washington Quarterly, and other publications. In 1976, when Dow Jones launched The Asian Wall Street Journal, Mr. Ching joined the new publication and worked as a reporter and editor. He also wrote a weekly column on political, social and economic developments in China. In 1979, he opened The Wall Street Journal's bureau in Beijing and remained there for four years, during which time he covered the emergence of China from the turmoil of the Cultural Revolution, the open-door policy, the trial of the Gang of Four, the opening up of the country to foreign investment and China's strategic alignment with the United States against the Soviet Union. In 1992, he joined the Far Eastern Economic Review. He wrote a weekly column, "Eye On Asia," in which he commented on political developments around the region.

For over a decade, Mr. Ching hosted a weekly current affairs TV program in Hong Kong, "Newslines," which appears every Sunday evening on ATV World.

Today, he writes a weekly column on China which appears in Hong Kong, Taiwan, Singapore, Malaysia, Japan and South Korea. Currently, in addition to writing, he is also Adjunct Associate Professor with both the Chinese University of Hong Kong and the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology.

Mr. Ching is the author of "ANCESTORS: 900 Years in the Life of a Chinese Family," (Morrow, N.Y. 1988; Rider 2009). Using his own family as a vehicle, he presented a history of China from the Sung dynasty to the present. He is also the author of "Hong Kong and China: For Better or For Worse," published jointly by the Asia Society and the Foreign Policy Association in New York, and "The Li Dynasty: Hong Kong Aristocrats," published by Oxford University Press.

Chairperson of the Women's Commission

Mrs. Stella Lau, J.P., Headmistress, Diocesan Girls' School has served as a Member of the Women's Commission since 2006 and was appointed Chairperson of the Commission in January 2012. She is also a Member of the University Grants Committee, Council for Sustainable Development, Research Ethics Committee (Kowloon Central / Kowloon East) of Hospital Authority, ICAC Complaints Committee, the Sir Jack Cater Scholarship Fund Selection Committee and the Chairlady of the Board of the Hong Kong Schools Sports Federation.

She served as a Member of the Council of CityU (2001-2007), the Broadcasting Authority (2003-2009) and the Committee on Performing Arts (2004-2010).

The Honourable Ms. Starry Lee J.P.
Member of the Legislative Council

The Honourable Ms. Starry Lee, an accountant by profession, is currently a non-official Member of the Executive Council of the HKSAR and a Member of the Legislative Council of the HKSAR. Ms. Lee is also the chairperson of the Financial Affairs Panel of the Legislative Council, member of the Education Panel, Constitutional Affairs Panel, Home Affairs Panel, and the Administration of Justice and Legal Services Panel.

Ms. Lee believes in democracy and wishes to build a better Hong Kong by participating in direct elections. She was first elected as a District Council Member in the Kowloon City District in 2000, and she succeeded in being re-elected to the same District Council constituency in the 2004, 2008 and 2012 District Council elections. In 2008, she participated in the elections of the Fourth Legislative Council election of the HKSAR and won a seat in the Kowloon West Geographical Constituency. In 2012, she was returned to the Fifth Legislative Council through the first ever and highly competitive election of "Super District Councillors" elected by voters from all over Hong Kong.

As the youngest female Legislative Councillor, Ms. Lee is dedicated to the raising of education standards and the building of a harmonious and upward moving society in Hong Kong.

Over the past 10 years, Ms. Lee has extensive experience in serving on various Government advisory boards. She is currently a director of the Hong Kong University of Science & Technology, a non-executive director of the Hong Kong Mortgage Corporation Limited and a member of the Insurance Advisory Committee.

Ms. Lee is also a vice-chairperson of Democratic Alliance for the Betterment and Progress of Hong Kong (DAB) and she is the spokesperson on financial affairs and education affairs of DAB.

Ms. Lee has been in the accountant profession for over 10 years. She graduated from the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology in 1996 with a BBA degree in Accounting, and she received an MBA degree from the University of Manchester in 2010.

Ms. Miriam Lau is a solicitor and Notary Public in Hong Kong and also a China-Appointed Attesting Officer. Ms. Lau has a long and distinguished record of public service. She was first appointed as a Member of the Legislative Council in 1988 and was elected as a Legislative Councillor for the Transport Functional Constituency in 1995. Ms. Lau had remained as a Member in the Provisional Legislative Council and the HKSAR Legislative Council until 2012. During her 24 years' service in the Legislative Council, she was the Chairman of the House Committee from 2003 to 2012.

Ms. Lau is a Deputy of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region in the 11th National People's Congress of the People's Republic of China. She is currently the Honorary Chairman of the Liberal Party of Hong Kong. She also serves as a Board member of the Hong Kong Airport Authority, member of the Hong Kong Maritime Industry Council and member of the Hong Kong Logistics Development Council.

Ms. Lau graduated from the University of Hong Kong with a BA Degree in English, and has a Diploma in Chinese Law.
